


### **Vertical Integration in the Insurance/PBM Space**





### **PBM Oversight: A Multi-Pronged Approach**



### Arizona

- Senate Bill 1382: PBMs Certificate requirements (Sen. Shamp)
- Requires PBMs to obtain a Certificate of Authority to operate and gives Department of Insurance & Fin. Institutions (DIFI) jurisdiction over PBMs.
- Gives DIFI authority for cease & desist order, suspensions, certificate revocation.
- Prescribes civil penalties for violations.

### HB 4348 Michigan

- HB 4348: Part of a sweeping bipartisan legislative package driven by House Speaker Jason Wentworth
- There had been NO PBM reform legislation ever introduced in Michigan prior to HB 4348
- The largest omnibus PBM bill in the U.S. ever introduced at state level – 31 pages.
- Bill filed by Rep. Julie Calley, R-Portland, MI
- APRx retained KJL Lobby Team

### HB 4348 Michigan

#### Licensing & Oversight of PBM's by Michigan Dept. of Insurance:

- DIFS authority over PBM License for specified violations.
- Requires quarterly transparency reports on wholesale acquisition costs, rebate disclosure and total rebates & fees not passed through to health plans.
- DFIS to prepare annual report on all PBM adjudicated claims to identify cost savings.
- Rule-making has started and APRx has submitted comments.



## Michigan

- HB 4276 Pharmacy Reimbursement
- For pharmacies with not more than 7 retail outlets: NADAC plus a formula-based dispensing fee for brands & generics.
- Moves issue to statute vs. annual renewal & appropriations of fee.
- Expansion of Immunization Authority :
  - HB 4316 & HB 4435



### **New Mexico**

- HB 451: Reimbursement Rates for Community-Based Pharmacy Providers
- Ensures that community-based pharmacy providers are fully reimbursed for the ingredient cost and professional dispensing fee for outpatient drugs in all Medicaid programs. The department shall identify and update, at least annually, a list of community-based pharmacy providers.
- Premise:
  - Mimic Managed Care FFS dispensing fee in Medicaid Managed Care Plans.

- Physician Dispensing: Three(3) bills
- Telepharmacy rules on distance




### HB 1763: Protecting Patient & Pharmacy Rights

- Prohibition of Retroactive Fees (Tx. Ins. Code §1369.553)
- No Prohibition of Mail or Delivery
- No Extra Professional Standards or Accreditations
- Reimbursement Parity
- Disclosure of PSAO Contracts
- Retaliation Prohibited
- Waivers by PBMs Prohibited



### Fierce PBM Opposition to HB 1919






### HB 1919: Anti-Steering of Pharmacy Patients

- Prohibits Requiring or Inducing Use of Affiliated Pharmacy (Tx. Ins. Code §1369.555)
- Prohibition of Steering Communications
- No transferring of records

- HB 1105/SB 749: Expansion of pharmacy immunizations
- HB 2021/SB1137: TDI reform bill for ERISA/Out of state plans
- HB 2079: Test & Treat
- HB 1293: NADAC plus FFS dispensing fee in Medicaid Managed Care

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• **HB 1283:** Medicaid Formulary HHSC 2033

#### Texas 2023 Misc.

- HB 4990: Texas Pharmaceutical Initiative State run PBM
- SB 1581: Establishment of Texas Health Insurance Mandate Advisory UH
- **HB 25:** Wholesale importation of prescription drugs to Texas
- **SB 2173:** Pilot Program on safe disposal of prescription drugs
- HB 2180: Co-Pay Accumulator
- SB 1915/HB 3916: DME reimbursement Medicaid

#### **American Pharmacies Federal**

#### Federal Trade Commission Taking Action – Finally:

- June 8, 2022: FTC launches (6)(b) study
  - Scrutinizing PBM Business Practices
  - Examining the impact of PBM Practices
  - FTC seeking compulsory orders

American Pharmacies has participated in live time discussions with FTC attorneys on a host of topics and plans further meetings in D.C.



### **American Pharmacies Federal**

#### Major Congressional Focus on PBMs:

- House Oversight & Accountability Committee announces PBM investigations.
- Senate Judiciary & Senate Commerce Committee has already marked up PBM legislation.
- Senate Finance has held a hearing on PBMs.
- House Energy & Commerce Committee had a hearing on transparency with a focus on PBMs.
- Senate HELP Committee has met in Executive Session on PBM Transparency: S.
  1339, The Pharmacy Benefit Manager Reform Act.

### **Key Federal Legislation APRx is Working**

#### The Pharmacy Benefit Manager Transparency Act (S.127):

- Bans deceptive unfair pricing schemes, including spread pricing.
- Prohibits arbitrary clawbacks.
- Requires PBMs to report to the FTC revenue made through spread pricing and pharmacy fees.
- Incentivizes Fair & transparent PBM practices.
- Passed out of Committee on a bipartisan 188-9 vote



### **Key Federal Legislation APRx is Working**

- H.R. 1770: The Equitable Community Access to Pharmacist Services Act
- H.R. 1613: Drug Price Transparency in Medicaid/S. 1038 Companion
  H.R. 2880: Protecting Patients from PBM Abuses Act
- H.R. 2679: PBM Accountability Act
- S. 1339: Pharmacy Benefit Reform Act
